KATHMANDU: The Ministry of Labour and Transport Management (MOLTM) and the International Labour Organization (ILO) on Thursday jointly held a one-day national conference titled 'Climate Change and Green Jobs' in the capital, with ILO constituents looking into various aspects of the promotion of green jobs in Nepal.
